

Information Request for Skillport IA Learning Path.

SkillPort Registration Process:

1. Students Fill out the registration form, shown below.
2. Have the registration form approved by your Government POC.
3. The Government POC will forward an encrypted copy of the completed registration form to [Doris Wright and Chrisaundra Smith](#) and mention in the email the user has been “approved” to receive an account in Skillport.
4. Student information will be loaded into the system within 3 – 4 days - if the form is filled out completely. Missing information requires follow-up with the student and POC, which will delay the process (will take longer if one or both Skillport POCs are on TDY).
5. The student should check their AKO email account for the userid and password - this is transmitted directly from ATRRS to the student. If it is not received in 4 days contact [Doris Wright or Chrisaundra Smith](#) to check the status.
